

## Ottawa Forklift License

Ottawa Forklift License - Within North America, acquiring a forklift license or forklift certification involves hands-on and classroom training. Regulatory control over licensing, certification and training for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of state, provincial and federal groups. Operators could acquire a license either by a third party or through training administered by the employer. In any case, regulatory requirements must be met. Recertification is required every two to three years.

The lift truck is a powered industrial machinery which is designed along with different options, like for instance sit-down and stand-up models, electric and propane versions, and different sizes and types to meet the industrial needs of workers. Operator training courses are often individualized to address the specific uses and types for which the operator is training. Training on a sit-down, gas-powered forklift in a warehouse setting will not be the same as training on a stand-up, propane-powered lift truck in a shipyard. The various lift trucks and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all equipment and industries. Regulatory standards, hence, tend not to concentrate on particular program requirements but rather on the outcome of individual training programs.

On the job training which is provided by the employer is the most common method of forklift training certification and licensing. The employer who offers this method of certification is required to offer classroom sessions and practical training on machines at their place of work. Employers may choose to train workers on every type of forklift separately, or to train them on all equipment combined. The curriculum incorporates lift truck operation methods, lift truck maintenance, safety measures and company regulations. Topics specific to the worksite, like for instance hazardous materials or conditions, must be included. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely utilize and operate every type of lift truck on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor usually requires an on-site component along with hands-on practice.

It must be noted that employer-provided certifications do not transfer from one employer to the next. Receiving a lift truck license through employer-provided training enables the operator to run a lift truck for that particular employer only.

Forklift safety would always be an important aspect of the lift truck license training, even if the specifics of the safety training will be dependent upon the machines being used. Some safety problems would vary for every employer and industry. Both third-party providers and employer-provided training may have to deal with extra requirements for safety training in applicable businesses, like in offshore and marine operations.
