Ottawa Order Picker Training - The order picker lift truck allows for people working in a warehouse setting to lift pallets making use of forks. This electronically-powered equipment is also called a stock picker and is like a forklift, allowing for a person to access high up places on a platform. Order pickers are normally found in warehouse environment and are helpful for specialized reasons.

The operator's platform is located near the floor. From there, the operator directs the unit forward, backward or from side to side, and lifts the blades to the appropriate level required for the job. To be able to access materials on a high shelf, the platform is elevated. The unit has a counterweight on the other end to provide balance.

Once the materials or merchandise have been chosen, the bucket is then lowered so that the unit could move on to the next site. Businesses would have their own policies as to whether the order picker can be moved with an elevated platform. Even though the unit could be utilized to place pallets on a shelf, stackers and forklifts are more often made use of for to stack pallets.

Because the unit is powered electrically, the battery has to be recharged quite frequently. This is a factor in factories and warehouses that run multiple shifts. Additional batteries can be purchased if the unit is in use during back-to-back shifts.

Before selecting an order picker, it is better to check the battery capacities of the specific models. Various pickers have their own weight limits and reach limitations. Different order picker models have various travel and lift speeds. The fork size likewise varies. The majority of order pickers have a fork size of around 1.5 m. While higher lift and travel speeds can help increase production, they could also result in more accidents. Operators utilizing order pickers should be trained well on the specific units they would be utilizing.
