Ottawa Telehandler Training Courses - Employers are responsible for ensuring that their supervisory and operating personnel are trained to work proficiently making use of telehandler machinery. The skill level of staff need to be assessed. If deficiencies are found, employers must provide training so that employees obtain the needed level of ability. The level of responsibility of the individual has to be considered when training is provided. Effective training will remedy any deficiencies in the understanding, knowledge and skills of telehandler supervisors and operators. Training could be undertaken through in-house session or by hiring an external training provider. An assessment at the completion of the training period will determine if the learning goals have been met or not.

Guidelines and regulations for the basic telehandler operator training and testing are set by federal, state/provincial and local regulators. Basic training does not address such subject matters as the lifting of people, the lifting of suspended loads, making use of various attachments, or the utilization of rotating machines. Further training should be undertaken if such tasks are needed on the work location.

Maintenance and Inspection

The telehandler requires routine maintenance similar to any other equipment. The machine would wear out sooner or later, so proper maintenance is needed to ensure the safe use of the telehandler machinery. Checks and inspections are important to ongoing maintenance procedures. Operators must have machine-specific training in order to prevent, rectify and monitor problems associated with deterioration, damage and wear. Employees need competence and experience in both breakdown and periodic maintenance. The preventive maintenance instructions of the manufacturer should be viewed seriously and complied with, considering such factors as environmental conditions in the work setting and frequency of use.

The user of the machine along with the owner of the machine share the responsibility for making certain that the telehandler is in full working condition. General maintenance is usually performed by the telehandler owner whilst pre-use checks are usually carried out by the user.
